The Grade I house was built in the 16th century, altered in the 17th, partly demolished in the 18th and finally restored by Sir Edwyn Lutyens in the 20th century. Gertrude Jekyll and Sir Edwyn advised on the layout of the lovely garden. The Manor is in the heart of the most beautiful village of Mells and its famous church where Siegfried Sassoon and Violet Bonham Carter are buried.

Suggested arrival time is from 11.30 onwards. Please note that parking in front of the Manor means that it will be difficult to depart early. If you do wish to do so, please try to arrive later and maybe, use the Talbot car park to begin with. We will book tables at the Talbot for 12.30pm.
